



Damaging your property and getting away with it? SB2154 (Finney) / HB2154 (McCord)

Permits are issued for hundreds of different reasons. This bill would exempt permit holders from being held accountable when they damage neighboring properties. Are you at risk?



What if someone was filling your pond with dirt?

Should a person be exempt from harming another person's property just because the activities causing the impact were covered under a permit? This bill would allow that to happen. You would suffer the consequences of someone else's actions and that person would not be held responsible.

Nuisance prevention laws protect us and our right to not be impacted by other people's actions. Permit or no permit, no one has a right to create problems to other people's properties and we have right to recover damages if someone else negatively impacts our property.
